1. Annual FIM Africa Medical Seminar

- The Medical Code 2024 was updated and adopted after 12 sessions.
- The 1st Seminar was held in August 2024.
- The 2nd Seminar was held in August 2025.
- The seminars enhanced regional participation and knowledge sharing.
- Zambia received an FIM grant for grassroots medical training, which is ongoing.



2. FIM Medical Mentorship Seminar 2025

- Scheduled for December 12–14, 2025, at Jamhuri MX Grounds.
- Organized alongside the Central African Challenge (CAC-2).
- Will be delivered by Dr. Furmanis from FIM International Medical Commission (CMI)
- International delegates Travel costs subsidized from the commission budget.
- Successful trainees will be eligible for CMI licenses.
- 3 doctors already trained via FIM e-seminars (MSA)



3. Grassroot Mobilization & Growth of Medical Fraternity in Africa

- African medics completed the Annual Medical Seminar and eligible for FIM-A CMO licenses.
- They continue to strengthen the Medical Commission's presence in their regions.
- Dr. Maria Chiboub (Morocco) led MXOAN 2024 in Marrakech; Dr. Joel Mafemba (Zimbabwe) led MXOAN 2025 in Donnybrook.
- FMNs continue training medics alongside national and regional events.
- MSA held two online seminars, training about 70 candidates.





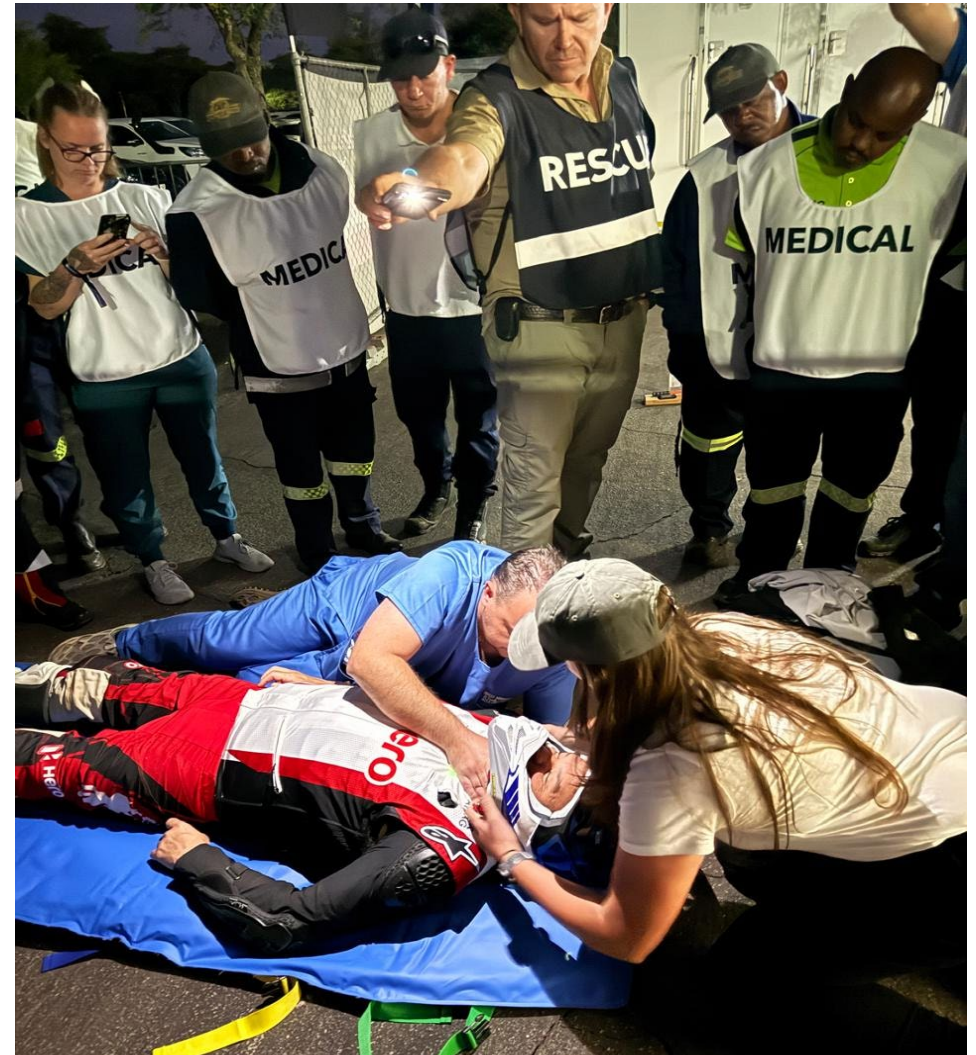
1. Emergency response Training alongside International/continental events

- The commission has leveraged on leveraging on events and collaborations to increase the medical response competencies of medics
- South African hosted **Safari Rallye**
- Rallye Raid series was sanctioned by both FIM and FIA
- Dr Derick was the CMO and useful networks were re-established with the FIM and FIA presidents.
- A substantial team was trained for the 10-day event including helimed extrication procedures



1. Emergency response Training alongside International/continental events

- Zimbabwe hosted MXOAN 2025
- Dr Joel Mafemba was the event CMO
- Training of 2 doctors and 10 paramedics was done
- Successful event with 2-7mins response times (Target 5mins)
- 4 ambulances and Mobile Clinic onsite
- e-FAST was available on site
- However, hospital waiting times was prolonged





2. Grass root training alongside local events

- This strategy continues to be a critical component of training up medics into the sport
- Before race briefs reminds all officials and medics again of the correct procedure in the case of serious injury or fatality.





1. FIM Africa Medical Code

- The Medical Commission reviewed the FIM-Africa Medical Code in 2024 over a period of 12 dedicated sessions
- It took into account the developments from the FIM Medical Code while still considering the limited resources available in Africa and not compromising on the safety of the sport and the rider
- It was adopted by circulation and Council for 2024
- It formed a central part of the Annual African Medical Seminar 2024
- The Medical will be reviewed again in 2026 for adoption in 2027.





2. Anti-doping – Ride True sensitization

- FMNs have made progress on anti-doping sensitization
- MSFK made a landmark achievement by Signing onto Anti-doping Agency of Kenya (ADAK) which is the NADO under WADA
- A successful overview sensitization seminar was delivered by ADAK to Riders, parents, coaches and ASPs on 04.11.2025
- The commission has scheduled a series of specific educational seminars and alongside sporting events to further engage athletes and ASPs





3. Digitisation of Medical and Injury Surveillance Database – Pilot in Kenya

- The concept began in 2024 after MXOAN 2023 in Cape Town.
- Adopted as a priority project and supported by FMN medics.
- Aligns with the FIM International Medical Commission priorities.
- Pilot set for 2026 in Kenya before Africa-wide rollout.
- Will integrate national injury registers with the FIM e-Injury system
